Articles of Dissolution by Incorporators and Initial Directors of Domestic For-Profit Corporation
Form DBU-8, Ver. 2, April 2018.

This form will allow a majority of the incorporators or initial directors of a corporation that has not issued shares or has not commenced business to dissolve a domestic business corporation.

Under the provisions of the Title 29 of D.C. Code (Business Organizations Act), the domestic filing entity listed below hereby applies for a Certificate of Dissolution and for that purpose submits the statement below.

1. The name of the corporation.

2. The date of its incorporation.

3. The effective date.

- 4. The following statements apply:
4A. That none of the corporation's shares has been issued.
4B. That the corporation has not commenced business.
4C. No debt of the corporation remains unpaid.
4D. The net assets of the corporation remaining after winding up have been distributed to the shareholders, if shares were issued.
4E. A majority of the incorporators or initial directors authorized the dissolution.

If you sign this form you agree that anyone who makes a false statement can be punished by criminal penalties of a fine up to \$1000, imprisonment up to 180 days, or both, under DCOC § 22-2405;
